PROFILE

With a career spanning over four decades including 28 years based in New York City, Chris McNulty has created a significant body of work as a performer, composer, recording artist and educator. Originally hailing from Melbourne, Australia McNulty's recordings and performances have garnered 5 and 4.5 star reviews from publications including **DownBeat, All About Jazz, The Irish Times, Jazz Wise, Jazz Journal, The Australian** and **Jazz Times** among many others. During her time in NYC McNulty maintained a consistent presence on the international jazz scene and continued to return to Australia appearing at major festivals and jazz clubs as well as presenting workshops and clinics at major music institutions. In May 2013, Chris was awarded the **Australian Bell Award for Best Vocal Jazz Album for "The Song That Sings You Here."** Her 2015 release "Eternal" (Palmetto) produced in collaboration with gifted Australian orchestrator Stephen Newcomb featuring chamber ensemble with jazz quartet placed #11 on the 80th Annual DownBeat Readers Poll for Album of the Year (USA). "Eternal" was also included in DownBeat Best Albums of 2015

Chris McNulty's emergence on the international jazz scene began around 1991 with her USA debut, *Waltz For Debby* (Discovery 1991). The album introduced McNulty to American audiences and received outstanding reviews. The album also features Chris' lyric to the Miles Davis classic, "Blue in Green" (published Warner/Chappell). In 1988, after being awarded an international study grant from the Australia Council McNulty headed to NYC where she went on to collaborate and record with many jazz greats including Gary Bartz, Mulgrew Miller, Billy Hart, Gary Thomas, Paul Bollenback, Montez Coleman, Ugonna Okegwo, John Hicks, George Mraz, Kenny Washington, Matthew Wilson and Marcus Gilmore among others. Her recordings include *Waltz For Debby* (Discovery), *A Time For Love* (Amosaya 1995), *LRemember You* (Mop Top 2002, Elefant Dreams 2005), *Dance Delicioso* (Elefant Dreams 2005), *Whispers the Heart* (Elefant Dreams 2006), *The Song That Sings You Here* (Challenge Records, 2013) and *Eternal* (Palmetto, 2015). McNulty has also appeared as a side musician on several other recordings (see *Discography*).

Chris returned to Melbourne in October 2015 to prepare for a 2016 nationwide tour with her "Eternal" Chamber Ensemble project. The tour included a sold out performance at the Melbourne Recital Centre; a regional tour in Victoria; Brisbane Conservatorium; Stonnington Jazz Festival, Perth International Jazz Festival and Wangaratta Jazz and Blues Festival.

Chris' vocal jazz education publication "Vocalist as Complete Musician - VCM" launched in late 2017. VCM is a method specifically designed for vocalists which utilizes tetrachords as a tool for in integrating theory, ear training and improvisation.
